The Quest Autism Programs Adult Day Site

In 2005, Quest Autism Programs (QAP) opened an Adult Day Site to meet the vocational, recreational and social needs of adults with Autism Spectrum Disorders. The program enrolls adults over age 21 who continue to require individual supports after they have completed their school-based education.

Vacation: QAP is closed for three weeks of vacation spread out

through the year.

Funding: Currently, our participants are funded through the

New Jersey Division of Developmental Disabilities. Additional funding is made possible via annual grants

from the Quest Autism Foundation.

Staffing: Participants are supported by a Job Coach in 1:1, 1:2

and small group ratios, according to their level of

independence and support required.




Training & Instructional Philosophy

Ongoing training and treatment are based on the empirically validated teaching strategies and techniques derived from the principles of Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA).

All of our participants have highly individualized programs designed by Board Certified Behavior Analysts. The program is focused on increasing on-task behavior and work endurance; teaching new skills and activities; maintaining previously learned skills; generalizing skills; and reducing challenging behaviors across the following areas.
